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Report on Gender Sensitization Activities of the Institution (2016-17 to 2020-2021)

INTRODUCTION:

Gender sensitization is a major issue in Indian Society. It is basically a male dominated society where women are always considered on a secondary place in every field of life. In the ancient Indians scriptures women was given a glorified status. She was an embodiment of *Shakti*. However, Manusmruti made such statement about women which relegated to a position of backwardness and timidity. Her status and respectful position in the society suffered during that time.

Indian constitution has given the equal status to both men and women. Indian society must practice the equality between male and female. Considering this fact the college has organized special workshops, lectures to sensitize the young generation on Gender Discrimination. It is a need that we should arrange programmes on this sensitive topic to reduce the barriers caused due to discrimination and gender bias. The main objectives of gender mainstreaming are equal career opportunities for men and women, Fair distribution of unpaid and paid work among women and men and equality of women and men with regard to political representation and participation. With the prevalence and gender discrimination and social norms and practices girls become exposed to the possibility of child marriage teenage pregnancy, child domestic work, poor education and health sexual abuse exploitation and violence. Many of these manifestations will not change unless girls are valued more.

Hence in order to inculcate these values many Gender sensitization seminar, workshops, Guest lectures of renowned persons were organized. The detailed report about these programs is as follows:

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Gender Youth Fest: 10 August 2016-

Gender youth festival was organized on 10th August 2016 by Co-curricular and Cultural Committee of the college in association with Ruby Social Welfare Society, Nagpur and Akshara, Mumbai. Both the NGO work for women's right issues in the society. This Gender Youth Fest aims at discussing and sharing the biased thought process about the status of men and women with youths through various games.

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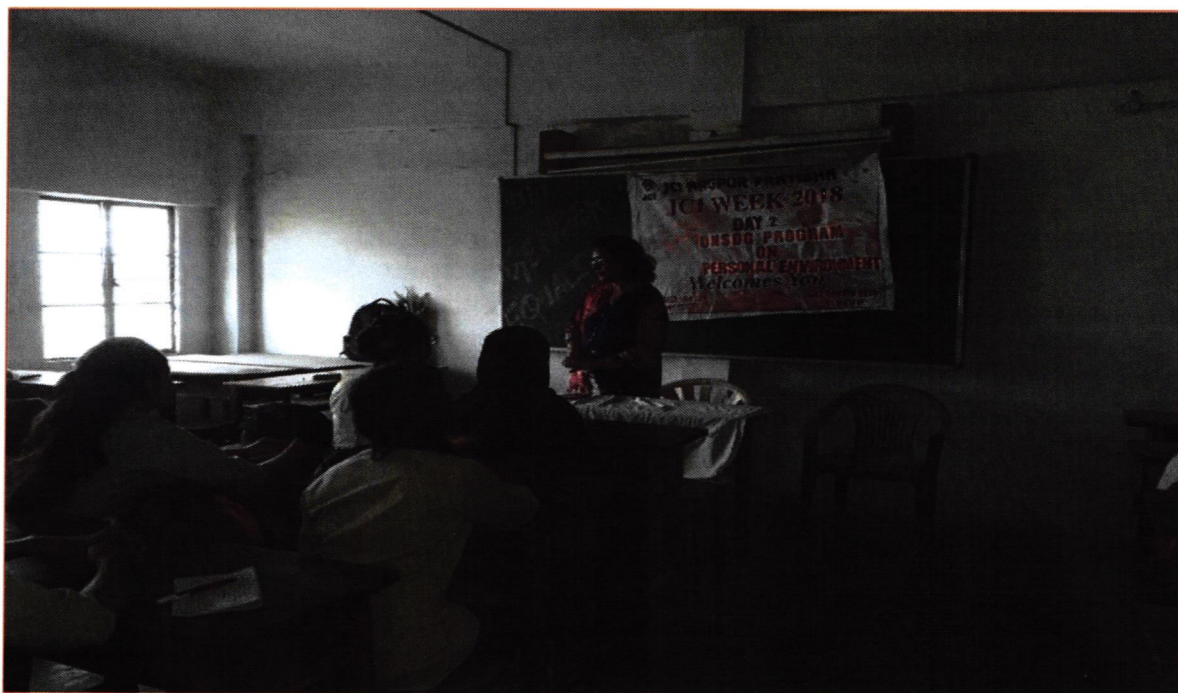
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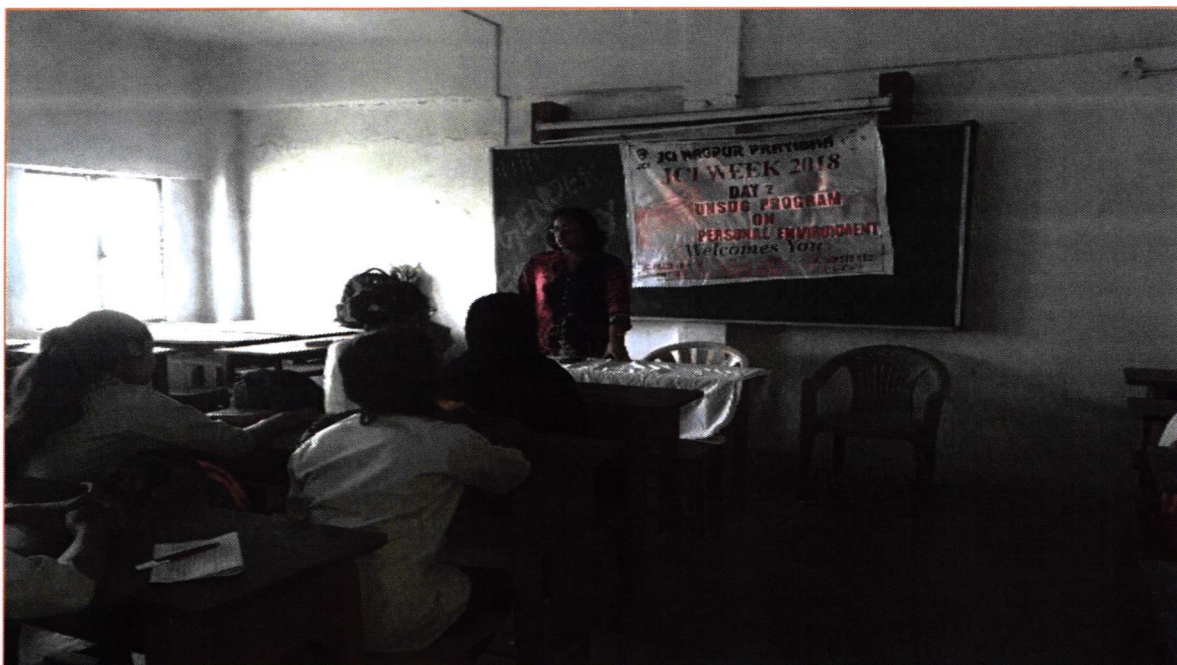
Women's Equality Day :

Gender is the state of equal ease of access to the resources and opportunities regardless of sex. Though India has achieved a great success in every field of life still it has a issue of gender discrimination. To create awareness on this issue Women's Equality Day was celebrated on 1st September, 2018. On this occasion a special lecture of Mrs. Kavita Agarwal, Motivational Speaker, Nagpur was organized. She explained gender equality means that the different behaviour, aspirations and needs of women and men are considered, valued and favoured equally. It does not mean that women and men have to become the same, but that their rights, responsibilities and opportunities will not depend on whether they are born male or female. She told about the rights mentioned in the constitution and discussed how gender equality is intrinsically linked to sustainable development and to the realization of human rights for all. She gave various examples of day to day life and explains how the society behave in a gender biased way. She focused on the family atmosphere where girl is given a secondary place than boy. 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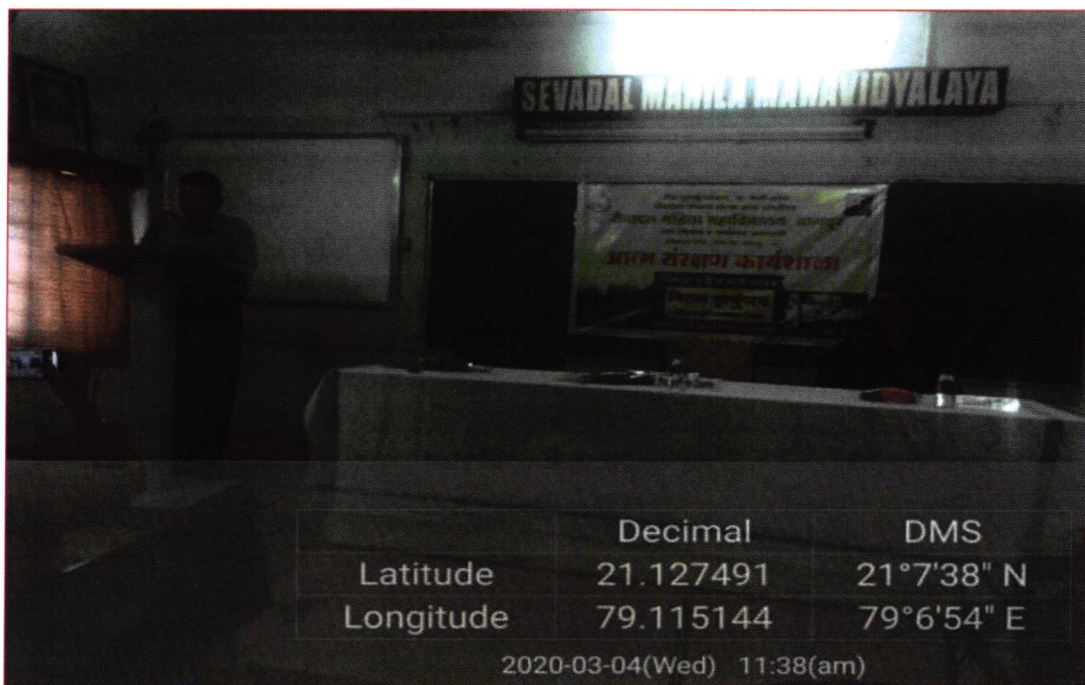
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8th March, 2020: Aatmsanrakshan Karyshala (International Women's Day)

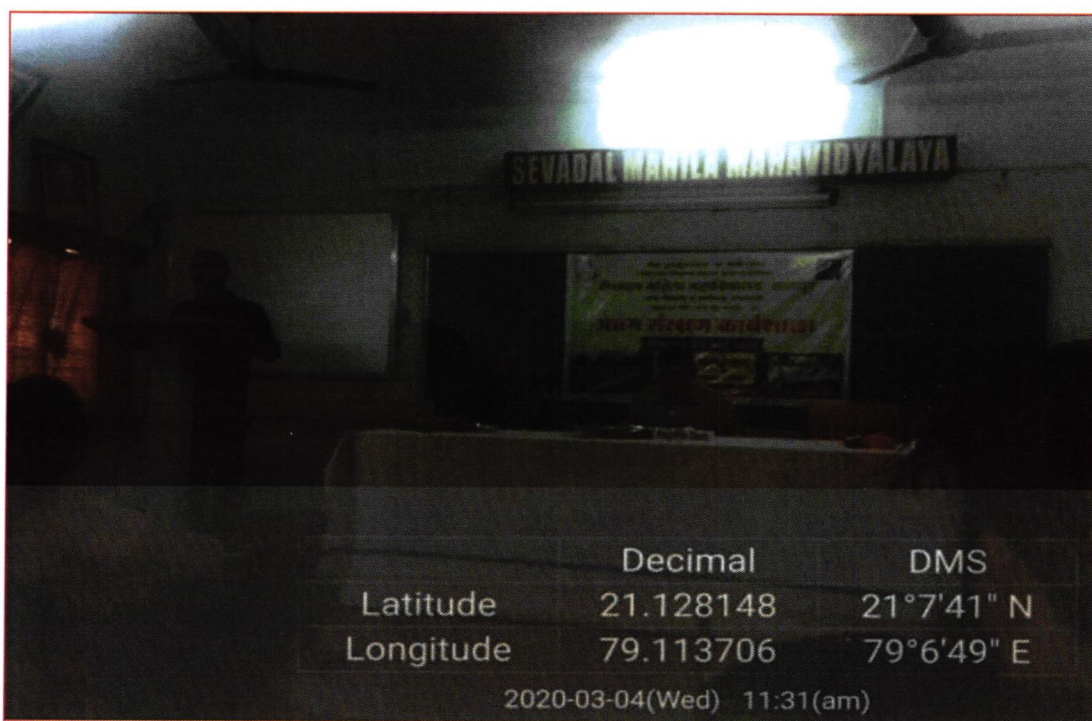
Every year International Women's Day is celebrated on 8th March to mark the contribution of Women in our lives and to the society. Around 70 students of the college, participated in the workshop and learned the techniques of Self defense and gained knowledge regarding Self Defense. The Workshop was organized as a part of Mission Mrutunjay initiative in association with Shivshakti Foundation. The workshop was inaugurated on 4th March 2020 at the hands of Hon'ble Prof. Pravin Charde, Principal, Sevadal Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nagpur. 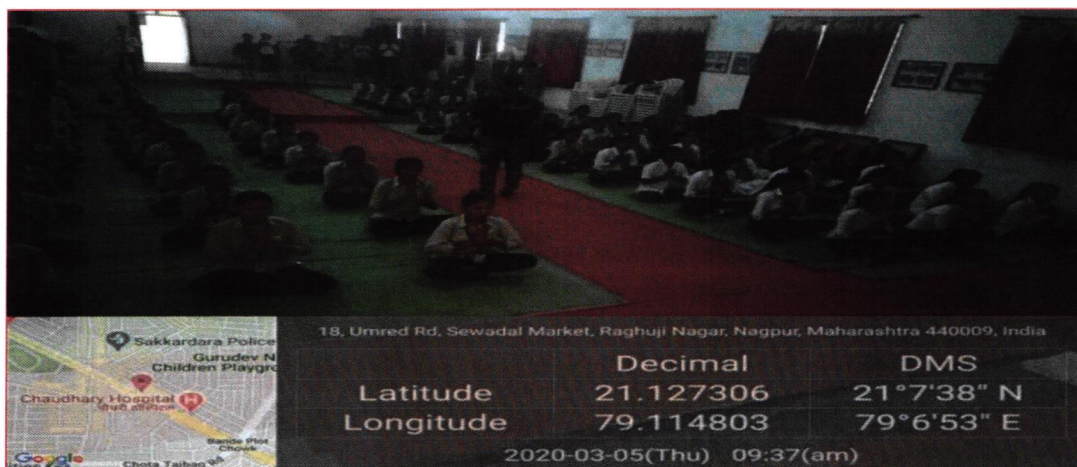

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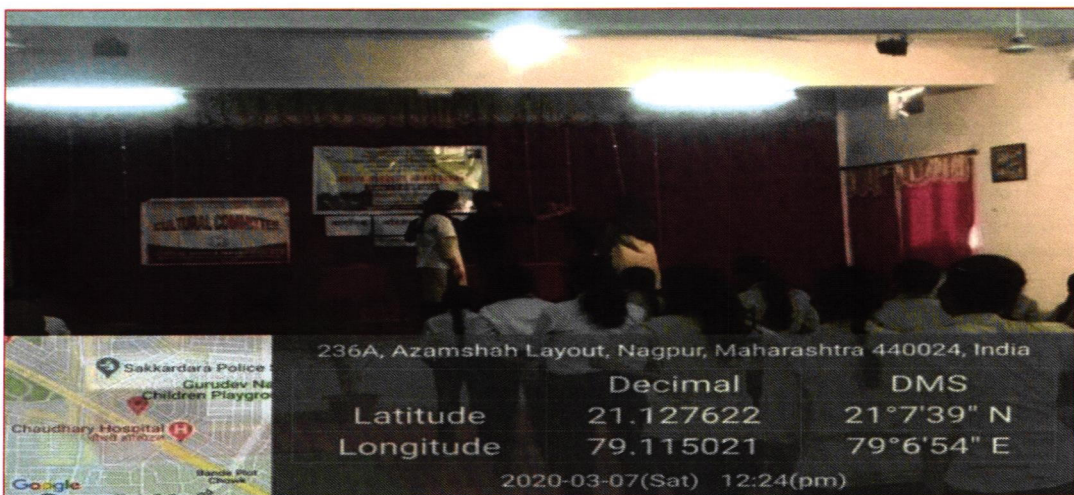

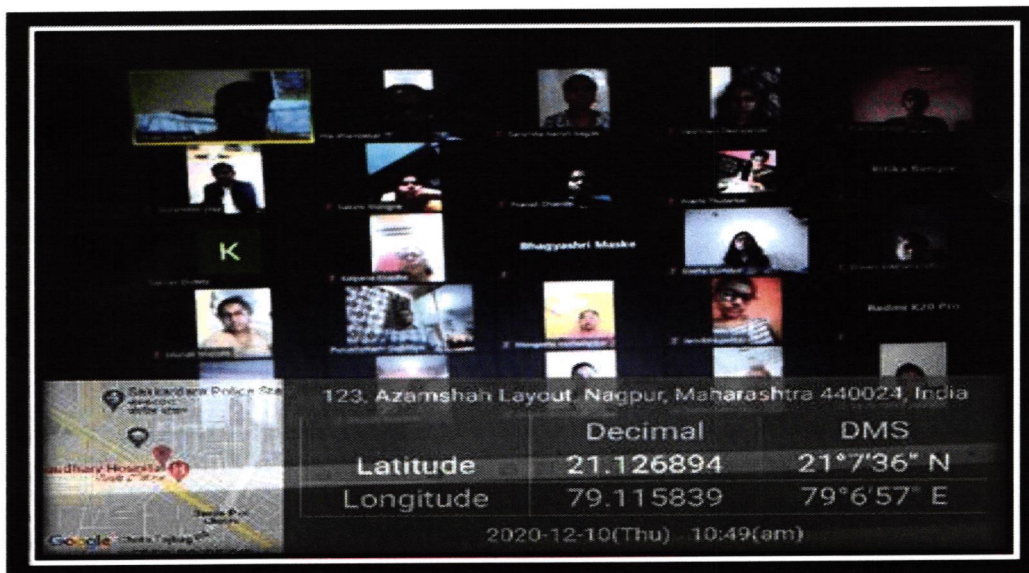
10th December 2020: International Human Rights Day:

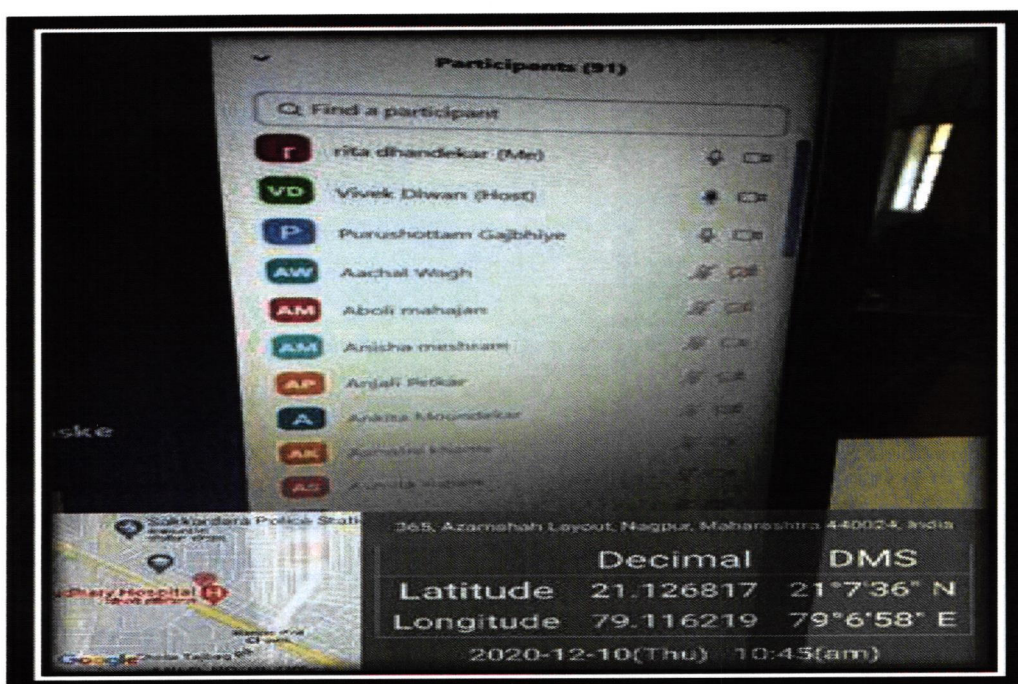

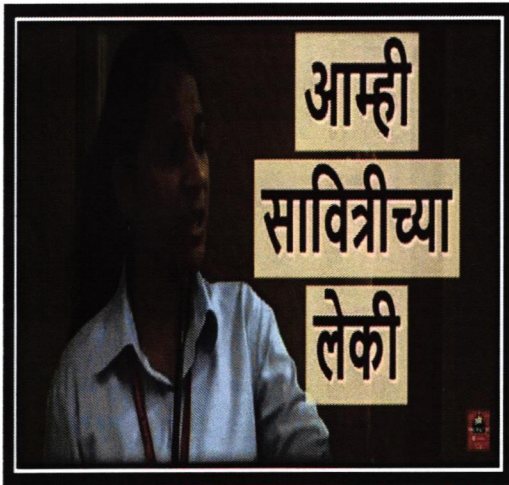

8th March 2021: Domestic Violence Act 2005- Nature and Legal Provisions

Adv. Prabha Sontakke- Counsellor, Gandhi Smarak Nidhi Trust, Pune.: On the first day of the program Advocate Prabha Sontakke, Counsellor, Gandhi Smarak Nidhi Trust, Pune was the guest speaker. She talked on the topic of 'Domestic Violence Act 2005 – Nature and Legal Provisions'. She described the journey of this Act. In Indian society domestic violence is the common scenario. Sontakke madam said that the essence of this Act is to provide a quick, easy and affordable civil remedy in the form of a protection order. She described the meaning of the term 'Domestic Violence' which covers the meaning of Physical abuse, Sexual abuse, Verbal and emotional abuse, economic abuse. She explained that any kind of hurt, injury or danger to life, limb, health, safety or well-being, whether mental or physical covered under the term domestic violence. She said that it covers all women who may be mother, sister, wife, widow or partners living in a shared household. An aggrieved person or any other person on behalf of the aggrieved person may present an application to the magistrate. It is the duty of the protection officer and the service provider to provide all assistance to the woman who is a victim of domestic violence. She also discussed about the nature of relief covered under this Act like protection order, monetary relief, custody orders and compensation. In the question answer session students asked various questions concerned with their own individual experiences in family matters which were answered by the guest speaker. Dr. Reeta Dhandekar, Convenor, Cultural committee conducted the session and proposed the vote of thanks.

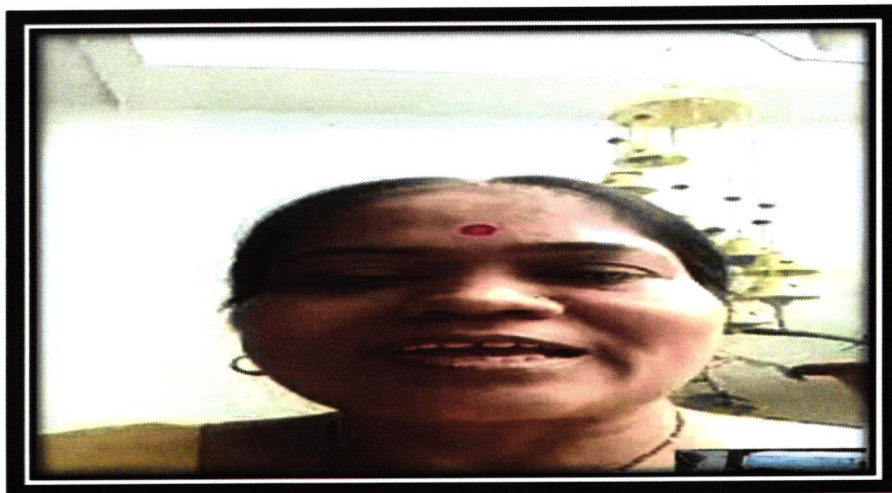
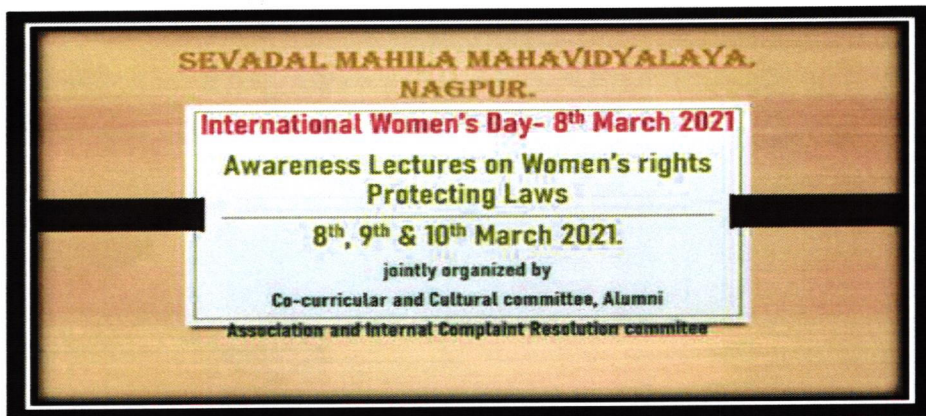

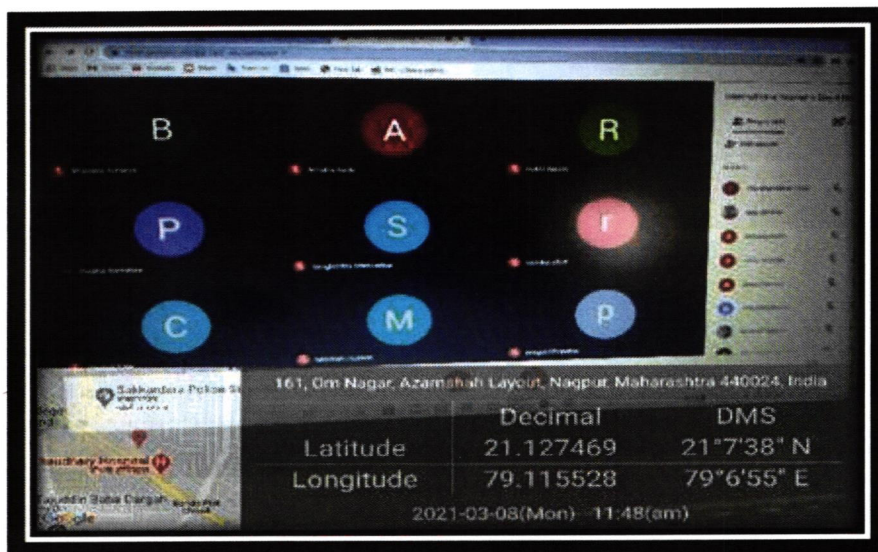

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9th March 2021: Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.

Speaker- Dr. Ragini Khubalkar, Asst. Professor of Law, Maharashtra National Law University, Nagpur.

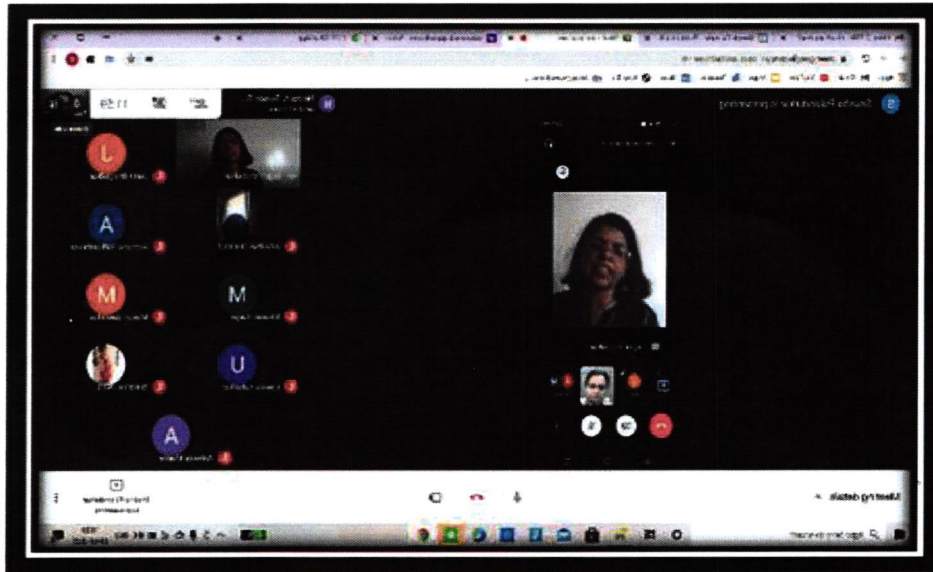
On the second day of the awareness lecture series, Dr. Ragini Khubalkar, Asst. Professor of Law, Maharashtra Law University, Nagpur delivered the lecture on Sexual Harassment of women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. Dr. Reeta Dhandekar introduced the guest speaker. She explained this topic in detail through power point presentation. She explained that Sexual Harassment at workplace is considered violation of women's right to equality, life and liberty. It creates an insecure and hostile work environment, which discourage women's participation in work, and eventually their social economic empowerment. Khubalkar madam said that the need for such legislation was observed first time by the Supreme Court, in the case of Vishakha Vs State of Rajasthan. The Act defines sexual harassment as unwelcome acts or behavior namely, physical contact and advances, a demand or request for sexual favors, making sexually colored remarks and other verbal and non-verbal conduct of sexual nature. She also focused on certain duties lays down by this Act on the employer and District officer like creating awareness on sexual harassment at workplace, sensitize the employees, assist the complaints committee in conducting inquiry etc. She said that this Act is very much important for creating an environment where woman can speak up about their grievances without fear and get justice but sensitization of men towards treatment of women at workplace is equally important. Over whelming response of the students was noted during question answer session which also remarked it as a very fruitful session. This session was compared by Dr. Reeta Dhandekar, Convenor, Cultural committee.

10th March 2021: Women's' Rights : Constitutional Provisions

Speaker- Dr. Saroj Agalawe, Professor and Head, Dpt. of Sociology, Women's College, Nagpur.: On the third day of the awareness lecture series, Dr. Saroj Agalawe, Professor and Head, Dpt. of Sociology, Woman's College, Nagpur delivered the lecture on Women's' Rights : Constitutional Provision.

Dr. Sushil Meshram, Head, Department. of Marathi introduced the guest. Dr. Agalawe madam said that the principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights and Directives Principles. The Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empower the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. She explained how Article 14 of the constitution embodies the general principles of equality before law and equal protection of Laws. Article 15 prohibits the State from any discrimination against any citizen on the basis of any one or more of the aspects such as religion, race, caste, sex, place of birth or any of them. Article 16 provides for equal opportunity to all in matter related to employment and other. She also explained the importance of Article 39, 39a, 39d which ensures the equal right to men and women to have an adequate means of livelihood. She said that Article 42 directs the State to make provision for securing justice and human condition for work for maternity relief is proving very crucial role in the development of women which is very invaluable contribution of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. She discussed the importance of Women reservation in Panchayat Raj system. She also expressed her concern that though the position of women has improved in the last four decades, but still, they are struggling to maintain their dignity and freedom. Presently Indian woman are facing the toughest time mentally and physically, mainly due to unawareness and lack of knowledge of legal and constitutional rights of woman. She congratulates the organizers for such an awareness activity which will be definitely fruitful for the students as well as society. Question answer session received a good response from the audience. This Session was conducted by Dr. Bharti Tapase, Convenor, Alumni Association. At the end of the lecture series Dr. Reeta Dhandekar, Convenor, Cultural committee proposed the vote of thanks.



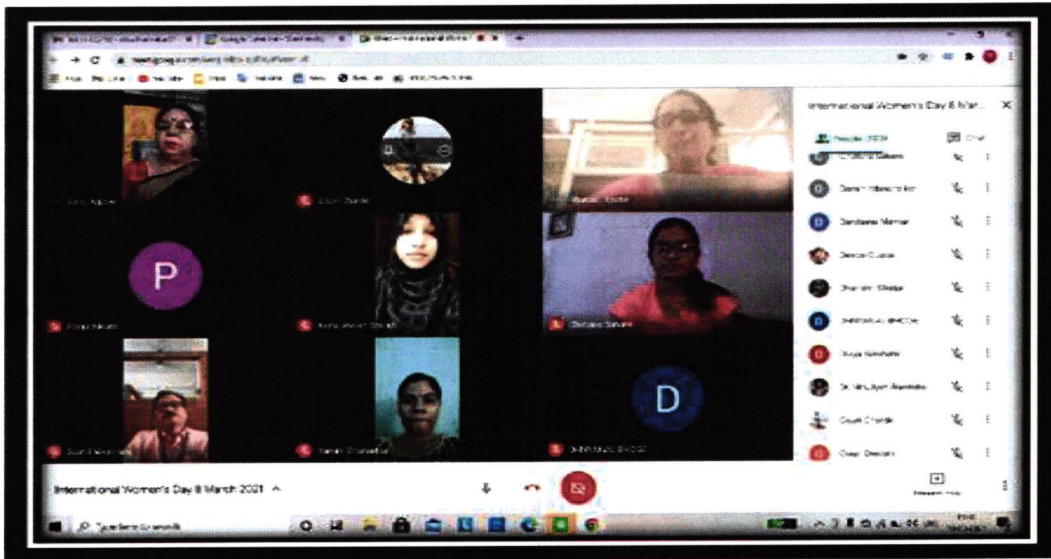
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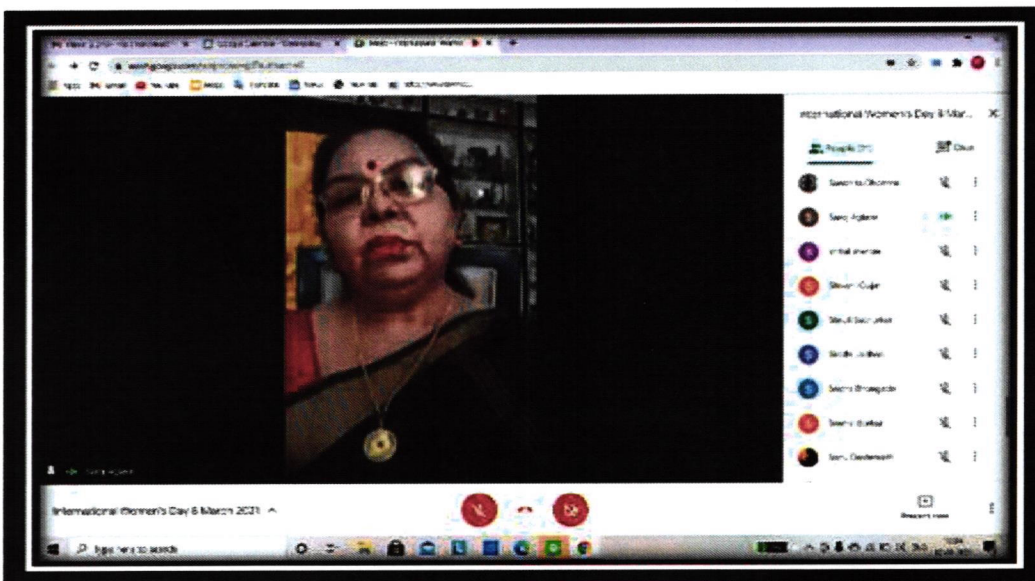
