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INTRODUCTION :

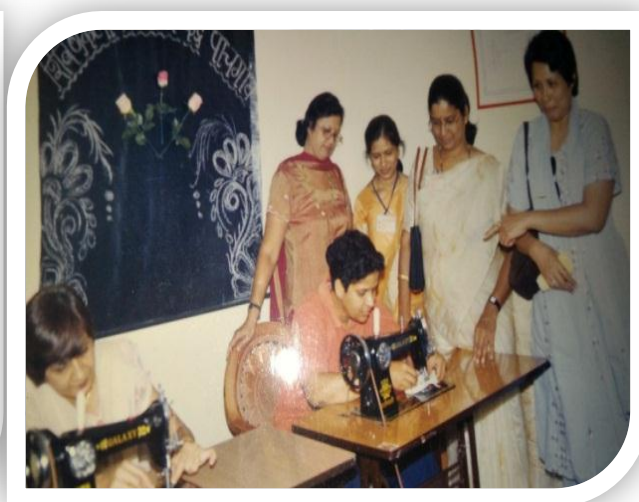


Inaugural Function of Sewing & Embroidery Training Center, Panchgaon.

The Sewing and Embroidery Training Centre was started at Panchgaon in the year of 2005-06 with the help of Lion's club, Nagpur Legend and Panchgaon Grampanchayat. Dept. Of Textile and Clothing of Sevalal Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nagpur, took initiative to train women of panchgaon village. For that the college had adopted the village Panchgaon for their social and economical development. As far as the economical development is concern, the college has planned to run this project for economically weaker women. The idea of establishing a training center is to provide the training to poor girls and women. In order to carry this process, we were committed ourselves to building a good faculty base. For this process we developed a memorandum of understanding with the Grampanchayat of Panchgaon village.



The management committee of Panchgaon Grampanchayat is extended their co-operation for this project. This training programme had been carried out for three months every year. Local authority of Panchgaon provided space and furniture for this project. In this programme we taught 15 to 20 young women age group between 18 to 35 years, teaching them different skills related to dress designing. They were taught various designs in blouses, salwar kameez, frocks, baba suit, petticoat, etc. and they were also given training in hand embroidery. For this we got **Three sewing machines from Lion's club, Nagpur Legend.**



The impact of this training was very effective in creating successful women entrepreneurs. The main aim of this project is to develop self-employment, self-dependency in women by stitching and embroidery education so that they can support their family financially.

For this training **Prof. Pravin Charde**, Principal Sevadal Mahila Mahavidyalaya, provided full co-operation and guidance. Mrs. Pramilatai Yelne, Saranch Grampanchayat, Panchgaon has provided full co-operation and allotted a room for training center.

In this centre, **Dr.(Mrs). N. A. Tiwade**, Head, Department of Textile and Clothing and **Dr.(Mrs). H. A. Padole**, Assistant Professor were deputed to train the rural women. Under their supervision **Mrs. Babytai Vaidya** local resident of Panchgaon was appointed to train the rural women.

As per prescribed syllabus training was given to student for different types of garments such as Kurta, Salwar, Blouse etc. as well as various types of embroidery stitches. For this course prospects was framed to introduce the knowledge about theory and practical for students.

At the end of training feedback forms were filled by the students for evaluation and to confirmed that students were satisfied by this course. Practical examination was conducted and certificate were distributed to them.



After Completion of **Nine** years the Sewing and Embroidery training Center of **Pachgaon** was shifted in Hostel premises of our college at **Narsala**, with the help of **Lions Club Nagpur South & Nagpur New Diamond** from 2014-15 Session. In this premises **Mrs. Nanda Fulmali** was appointed to train the rural women. Our department organized **Tie and Dye workshop** for the students.





In this workshop we taught different methods and techniques of tie and dye. We also explained and guide them how to start self employment activity from home. All of them participated in workshop with keen interest. The women were satisfied after the completion of the course.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT:

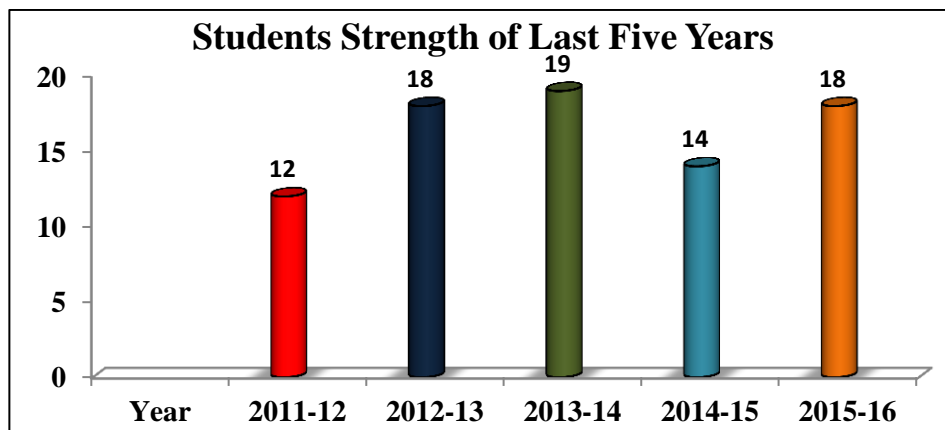
- ◆ To orient the student about the fabrics.
- ◆ To learn the properties of various textile fabrics.
- ◆ To understand the principles of clothing construction & its application.
- ◆ To gain the practical knowledge of sewing and embroidery.

NEED OF THE PROJECT :

This project specifically focused for the empowerment of rural women. More than **hundred** women were benefited by this project. The tailoring and embroidery activity is a motivating for women empowerment. The primary objective is to enable women to earn some income from tailoring practice. The secondary objective was to establish social forums where women can freely discuss their issues and problems and also enhance other skills, enabling to improve their livelihood.

The trained women have not been able to increase their income , as they need to further refine their skills. Some women have taken loans from local banks and purchased their own sewing machine. Some women stitched clothes for their family members.

Almost 25% women students have been benefitted every year by this training.
